The school is collaborating with National Environment Agency (NEA) and Hillview@Elias RC on a Values in Action (VIA) programme, Litter-free Neighbourhood, for P4 students. The objectives are to:

- develop and instill a sense of pride and belonging to Pasir Ris neighbourhood
- helps students understand that they play an important role in caring for the neighbourhood
- provide a platform for students to contribute to a clean and green Pasir Ris neighbourhood
- guide students in empathising with the cleaners

During the programme, students will be picking litter at selected residential blocks in Pasir Ris West. They will undergo a series of pre-VIA lessons to equip them with the necessary knowledge, skills and values to prepare them for the programme. We are privileged to have the opportunity to work in partnership with NEA in the conduct of the NEA Clean Singapore Trail to enable our students to develop a deeper understanding of the importance of keeping Singapore clean.

C. P5 Interactive Heritage Trail (iHT) at Singapore River (Mdm Ellia, SS Coordinator)

As part of field-based learning in Social Studies, the school is organising an Interactive Heritage Trail (iHT) at the Singapore River for all the P5 students. The objective of this trail is to enhance the teaching and learning of citizenship education and the humanities curriculum through mobile technology-enabled learning experiences in the field. During the trail, students will:

- make explicit connections between their classroom experiences and the immediate environment
- leverage on ICT (3G, GPS, Image Recognition and Bluetooth technologies) to facilitate authentic place-based learning
- take ownership of their learning as it allows them to acquire information independently
- develop communication skills by interviewing the public and working in teams

Students will be required to report to school as per normal and they will have their usual lessons until 12.30pm that day. They will have their lunch in school before they leave for the Singapore River.
