- 4. CCAs are conducted on Fridays for all **P3 to 6 students** from 7.30am to 9.00am and may also take place on weekdays (Monday, Tuesdays and/or Thursdays), from 3.30pm to 5.30pm, depending on the individual CCA training schedule.

- The registration period is from <u>1st November to 8th November 2022</u>. For parents who fail to register within the registration period, the school reserves the right to assign CCA to students according to availability. The results of the P2 CCA registration exercise will be released in January 2023.
- 7. Admission to CCA groups is based on aptitude, interest, choice and medical conditions. As each CCA can accept only a maximum of students which is based on the teacher/instructor to students' ratio as well as the limited physical and venue resources, we seek your understanding if we are not able to accommodate to your requests on CCA placement.

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ANNEX A

CCA Policy

Frequently Asked Questions

1) Is CCA compulsory for all levels?

CCA is only compulsory from P3 to P6 in our school. All students are encouraged to participate actively in 1 CCA. The school has specially built in CCA during curriculum time from 7.30 am to 9.00 am on every Friday to ensure mass participation and that every child has the opportunity to develop his or her talents as well as other salient traits like leadership and life skills.

Students from selected CCAs may have to undergo at least twice weekly training sessions (refer to training schedule on the website) after school (especially during peak session) and during school holidays. CCA school training may also have different starting time for certain levels due to the availability of resources.

2) How do students sign up for CCA? What is the entire process?

At end of P2, the school will offer our students a selection of CCAs in P3. Students are to sign up during the recruitment exercise in November (by filling in 4 options for CCA via an online form given in November). Should all 4 options be exhausted, the CCA department will follow up with the child to select a new CCA or channel him/her to an available CCA. CCA offered to students will be based on their talents, interests and medical conditions (Sports CCAs require clearance from School Health Services on child's physical condition).

3) What are the advantages of being in a school team?

Identified students with potential and talent in sports or visual/performing arts will be provided with enhanced skills training and confidence development to grow their talent and interests in the various Co-Curricular Activities (CCAs) as members of the **school teams**. Students in the school teams will be trained by professional coaches / instructors and provided with opportunities to represent our school in various zonal / national competitions or performances/exhibitions. The exposure gained to compete or perform in Zonal or National level will help your child to benchmark against high standards and build your child's competency level for improvement.

All students accepted into our school teams must maintain at least 90% training attendance. The school reserves all rights to remove any student from the school teams should their attendance fall below the required percentage.

4) Do competitive sports train twice a week?

Be prepared that your child may be required to train at least twice a week due to the nature of competitive sports. Certain sports like Volleyball and Hockey have different days for different levels to train (refer to school website for schedule). Training sessions may increase if necessary (for e.g. qualification to National finals). Space constraints and availability of equipment are some factors considered in our planning.

5) Are students allowed to withdraw from CCA? Will they be penalized in any way?

Students are encouraged to stay with only one CCA from P3 onwards. Students must remain in the CCA for **at least 6 months** before they can request to switch to another CCA. Students can only change CCA once in their stint with PVPS from P3 to 6. Students are not allowed to change CCA in P5 and 6. A letter of explanation from parents to the CCA affected will be required. Change



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to a new CCA will be subjected to availability. Students who do not have a three year record in one particular CCA will not be eligible for EAGLES award.

6) What about home transport arrangement for my child/ward who has training sessions on weekday afternoon?

For training sessions that occur in the weekday afternoons (P3-P6), parents will have to make alternative transport arrangements for students who have pre-existing school bus arrangements to go home.

7) Can my child join more than one CCA?

As our CCAs occur during curriculum time, all students can only participate in 1 CCA.

8) What is external CCA?

To help the school better manage our CCA programme and to cater to the different needs and interests of our students, you may wish to provide details of any sports/games activities that your child/ward is currently or competitively involved outside school (for eg competitive swimming, golf, international chess, Taekwondo etc) and that you may wish your child/ward to represent the school in school competitions in these sports/games. The school will try our best to provide the necessary support in case your child/ward is eligible to take part in the school competitions.

The school would then take into consideration the following before endorsing student's participation:

- Student's level of preparation for the competition, e.g. no. of years of training, recommendation from coach/ instructor, competency/readiness for competition, etc.
- Type of competition, e.g. individual event, pair/team events.
- Duration of competition, i.e. preferably not more than 2 days of competition.
- Timing of competition, i.e. competition is preferably held outside curriculum time as it would minimise impact on accompanying Teacher missing lessons.
- Manpower constraints to accompany student for the duration of the competition.
- Conflict of competition days with internal school events/ programmes/ examinations.
- Overall performance & behaviour of student in school.

9) Which CCA are for boys and which are for girls only?

Football and Hockey are catered for boys only. Netball are for girls only. All other CCAs are catered for all.
